Creating a Community Wimple

A traditional wimple is a Torah binder.

We will expand on that definition as we create one large communal art piece that represents Har Zion and becomes a "community binder." In this session, Tyvek, a non-woven polyethylene product, will serve as the "cloth" for the wimple, while scissors, paint and markers will help transform it into a new ritual object.

We will revive, reinterpret and reinvent the wimple.

Rachel has shown her work at the Jewish Museum in NYC, the Contemporary Jewish Museum in San Francisco, American Jewish University, Hebrew Union College, and the Society for the Advancement of Judaism and Temple Emanu-El in NYC among other places. Her piece "Fringed Garment" is in the permanent collection of the Jewish Museum. In addition, she has lectured and given workshops at the Jewish Theological Seminary, Temple Adath Yeshurun in Syracuse, NY and Brandeis House in NYC.
