Following his experiences as a commander in the Nahal Battalion, Shmuel Levi began to write, produce and perform a play. Through his memories, the audience is given a window into the inner thoughts and questions of a young man who goes to war to defend his country.

“Memories” exposes the complexity of life in Israel and sensitively portrays a complicated message - a belief in humankind and a hope for a better future in a reality of war and terror.

In this session, Shmulik will share clips that he filmed in Israel of his play and will speak live to the audience in the reflection time.

Shmulik Levi is a Camp Galil shaliach and Adath Israel Makom teacher. Following his experiences as a combat soldier in the Nahal Battalion during the Second Lebanon War, Shmulik wrote a play.

Filled with the inner thoughts and questions that arise from the experience of a young man who goes to war to defend his country, the play touches on themes including complications of life in Israel, questions of terror, peace defense fighting, life and death.
