In her short and poignant poem, Goldberg describes the yearning of even the fields and the seas to be in relationship with the Divine. She suggests that those living through difficult times without faith are as hollow and empty as sleepwalkers.

In a bit of a paraphrase of Leah Goldberg, I'd say it would have been hard to live without the Har Zion community this past year. I can't count the number of times people have expressed to me their gratitude for being a part of this amazing community of generous, caring and concerned individuals. Attachment to Judaism and the rhythms of Jewish life has proven to be a powerful force in difficult times.
