Furthermore, a survey conducted by the Center for Antisemitism Research revealed that a staggering 70 percent of college students believe that more should be done to combat antisemitism on campus. These statistics underscore the urgency of implementing effective measures to address this pressing issue.

I am writing to express my full support for the memo "Combatting Antisemitism in Pennsylvania's Educational System," which includes House Bill 2001, House Bill 1986, and House Resolution 311. These legislative proposals offer crucial steps toward combating antisemitism and promoting a culture of inclusivity and tolerance in our educational system.

House Bill 2001, which recognizes antisemitism as bullying/harassment on college campuses, is a vital step in ensuring that incidents of antisemitism are appropriately addressed and that Jewish students feel supported and protected.
