MEMORIAL RESOLUTION FOR ALAN BOROFF

Alan E. Boroff, Esquire, past president and long-time volunteer leader at Har Zion Temple, died on Tuesday, September 13, 2016 (10 Elul 5776) at age 84. During his last difficult months, Alan remained an active Har Zion member, who attended Shabbat services and socialized with his community, whenever he was able to do so.

Alan was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York. As a young man, he made his way to Philadelphia, where he graduated from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania with a B.S. in 1953.

While at Penn, Alan met Barbara Russock. They were married in 1955, and remained an exemplary couple for 60 years.

After graduating from college, Alan served in the United States Army, stationed for part of the time in Japan. Upon his honorable discharge, Alan and Barbara briefly left the Philadelphia area for Alan to attend Harvard Law School, from which he graduated in 1958. Alan and Barbara then returned to the Philadelphia area and ultimately settled in Wayne, Upper Merion Township. Alan was admitted to the Bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania in 1959.

As a young family, Alan and Barbara joined Har Zion Temple and in particular, Har Zion Radnor. Almost immediately, Alan became active in all aspects of the Har Zion Radnor community, was elected to the Har Zion Radnor Board, and ultimately served as chair of the Radnor Board. While chair of the Radnor Board, he developed a life-long friendship with the then rabbi at Radnor, Rabbi Gary Charlestein.

When the new Har Zion building in Penn Valley opened, Alan quickly transitioned into leadership of the merged Har Zion Temple community. He was elected to the Har Zion Board of Directors. Subsequently, Alan was elected to a variety of officer positions, including synagogue counsel, and ultimately served as president of Har Zion Temple from June 1994 to June 1996.

During his term as president, Alan stressed the importance of attendance at Shabbat and holiday services, Jewish education and a commitment to living a Jewish life. He recognized that Har Zion must function as a center for cultural, social and community activities to heighten the interest of all its members. Har Zion continued to grow in size, as it approached its 20th anniversary in Penn Valley.

In addition, during Alan's presidency, the Voluck Chai Tablet became available to recognize contributions in honor of simchas within the Har Zion community. The Board of Directors approved the "Board Standards" for directors and officers of Har Zion Temple, as well as a strong report on leadership development. For the first time, an educational component was introduced into meetings of the Board of Directors. Planning began for the celebration of Har Zion's 75th Anniversary. In addition, Alan had the unique opportunity to welcome to Har Zion Temple and sit on the bimah with Vice President Al Gore, as the Vice President was the featured speaker at the annual meeting of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia.

Following his term as president, Alan remained active in leadership, a regular attendee and active participant at meetings of the Executive Committee and Board of Directors, and a mentor to all presidents who followed him. He rarely missed a Shabbat service, when he was in town.

Alan practiced municipal law for 58 years, primarily with Boroff Harris Heller in Plymouth Meeting and then with Flamm, Boroff & Bacine in Blue Bell. The latter law firm split up in 2010. Alan was of counsel for Brown & Silbergeld in Bridgeport through 2014, when he retired. Although his client base was within the state of Pennsylvania, Alan was best known

for representing Upper Merion Township, Royersford, Skippack, and Springfield Township, Montgomery County.

Alan served as president of Tau Delta Phi, his college fraternity; did pro bono legal work his entire career for Lafayette Ambulance and Rescue Squad, as well as the Upper Merion Township Employee Scholarship Committee; and served on the Upper Merion Township Planning Commission from 1974 to 1979.

Alan and Barbara loved to travel, and together they visited all seven continents. Alan enjoyed skiing, camping and hiking. Alan and Barbara shared a passion for contemporary glass. Over the years, they collected many fragile art objects. They had the pleasure to donate contemporary glass to the Museum of Art & Design in New York and the Chrysler Museum in Norfolk, Virginia.

In addition to Barbara, Alan is survived by his daughters Lisa Boroff Berkowitz (Arthur), Joan Boroff Denenberg (David) and Marcy Boroff (Maria Veneziano); his brother-in-law Robbie Russock (Carla); and his grandchildren Emily (Jonathan Fridberg), Julie and Jacob Berkowitz, Becca and Jesse Denenberg, and Hannah Boroff.

We miss Alan and his significant contributions to the Har Zion community.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Memorial Resolution be spread on the minutes of the Board of Directors of Har Zion Temple, a copy be published in the Har Zion Bulletin, and copies be sent to Alan's family.

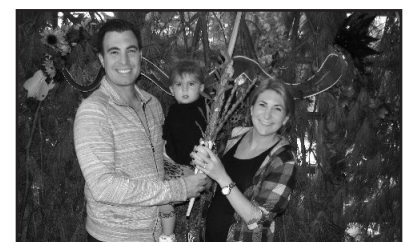
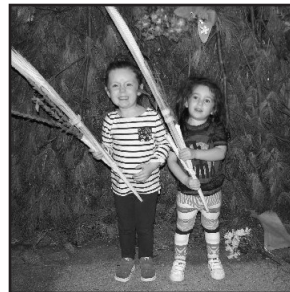


Building Community

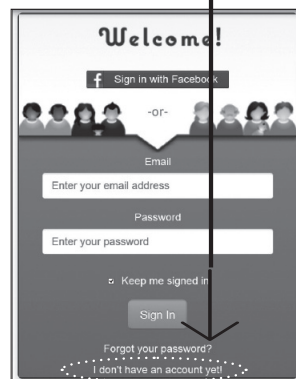

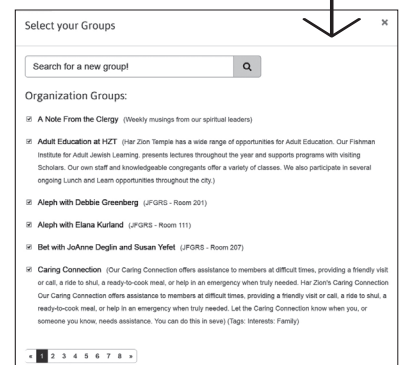
