Message from Rabbi Rosenberg



Whenever I return to Jerusalem after having been away for more than a month, I make sure to stop and enjoy something sweet, or raise a glass as a *L'chaim* to honor this magnificent city. Pleasant food and/or drink start my visit along with the recitation of the *She-he-che-yanu*, the blessing that thanks God for keeping us in life and enabling us to find joy and meaning in the moment.

Interestingly, greeting Jerusalem and celebrating her with food and drink has not always been the traditional Jewish way. The Talmud (Moed Katan 26a) makes it clear that when one first sees Jerusalem having been away for more than 30 days one should rend their garments in mourning as one does when a close relative dies. The Talmud discusses exactly what it means by Jerusalem. Is it the site of the Temple? Is it the Old City? Is it the Arey Yehudah, the locations just outside of Jerusalem? In antiquity and even today amongst some Jews, a visit to Jerusalem meant entering a zone of mourning for the Temple that was destroyed and the city as a whole.

Since the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948 and the reunification of Jerusalem in 1967, many Jews have questioned this practice of mourning. They have cited great Rabbis like Rabbi Joseph Karo and Rabbi Joel Sirkis who were respected communal leaders in the 16th century who taught that rending a garment upon seeing Jerusalem only applied if the area was governed by non-Jews. With this as a strong legal foundation, many Jews choose not to engage in any mourning practices when they visit Jerusalem. Jerusalem is the capital of the Jewish State of Israel, a modern day miracle in spite of the political challenges she faces.

So instead of mourning, we celebrate. We eat! We drink! And this month, as we continue our eight month-long journey, *Engaging Jerusalem*, we will celebrate her gastronomic riches and throughout we will celebrate her wealth and enjoy her complexity.

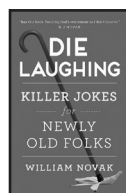
Author Alexandra Zapruder in conversation with Har Zion Temple's Norman Einhorn.

Instead, Zapruder's 26-second home movie captured President Kennedy's assassination and thrust Zapruder – and his family – into the national spotlight for decades.

As I gathered my donations for Har Zion's Martin Luther King Day of Service, I happened to find a copy of the April 2005 Har Zion Bulletin and wanted to share part of an article by David Shore, Men's Club past president. – Jack Marine, Men's Club Co-President

Days of Future Past

Written in 2005 by HZMC Past President David Shore
Jewish history is filled with many stories of slavery sorrow and redemption, none more familiar than the story of Passover. Each year we gather around the Seder table with our families and read the Haggadah to tell of our ancestors' Exodus from Egypt. Be reliving the same story, the same time each year we immortalize the message to all future generations. This is why the Passover Seder is such a central holiday in our calendar and it celebrated by the majority of Jews around the world. I will never forget the time my daughter asked me how there could be a God if he let the Holocaust happen. Just like my parents, I struggled with the answer. So many of our holidays remind us of Anti-Semites who throughout time have attempted to destroy us. It seems that all through history one thing is constant; someone always wanted to destroy the Jewish people. Six million died at the hands of the Germans, but how many died in the destruction of the two Holy Temples, the Inquisition, the Crusades and the Chmielnicki Cossack Pogroms. Today, Anti-Semitism continues to show its ugly face in all four corners of the world. How can we appropriately memorialize our ancestors who gave the ultimate sacrifice for faith which they cherished so much? One way is to strengthen our commitment to Judaism. By doing so, we link our lost relatives to ourselves, our children, and to Judaism for eternity. To those who survived the Holocaust the images are just as horrific today as they were when it happened. To our children it may seem like ancient history. This is why we need to tell our children the story of the Holocaust each year, at the same time just as we tell the story of Passover.

Isn't it amazing that Anti-Semitism lives on, and as Holocaust survivors pass away, it will be more and more challenging to inspire our children to learn about this history. But the Men's Club will continue to send out the Holocaust Remembrance Yellow Candles to help keep the memory of the Six Million alive. Please join us at our Annual Dinner Meeting on **Thursday, March 23** to assemble our 800 Yellow Candle cartons to be sent out to all members of Har Zion to commemorate the Holocaust at home. Then on **Sunday, April 2**, join the HZMC along with Har Zion High School at 10 AM to pack these 800 cartons with the Yellow Candles to be mailed out (Continental Breakfast included) This year we observe Yom Hashoah on **Sunday, April 23**. Please join the HZMC on **Friday mornings at 7 AM** for minyan in the Dogole Chapel followed by Tisch in Rabbi Rosenberg's office – it's a great way to start your weekend and get ready for Shabbat. We look forward to seeing you there!

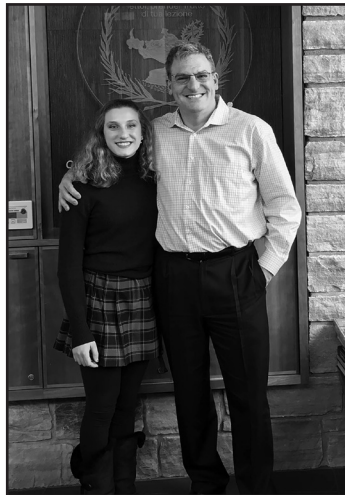

Agnes Irwin Meets the PaperClips Project

On January 10, my school, Agnes Irwin, held our second annual CommUnity in Action Day. This day focused on increasing unity within our community by encouraging students to lead workshops regarding issues of culture, identity, and mental health. I am part of the Jewish Student Union (JSU) where we strive to unite and educate our community about Judaism. We invited Norman Einhorn to speak at one of the workshops to educate my community



about the influence of the Paper Clips Project. Norman spoke about how the Project got started, its impact, and how it expanded into an international effort to collect over 11 million paperclips. He explained that paperclips were chosen because not only was the paperclip invented by a Norwegian Jew, but it also was worn in solidarity by Norwegian Jews during the Holocaust. Paperclips were sent from all over the world to a small town in Tennessee after one student asked her teacher "what six-million looks like." Norman also discussed Har Zion's relationship with the students from the Project, highlighting our annual trips to Tennessee and the trip to Israel we took with them two years ago.

Norman used the Project as a means to teach my community lessons about legacy and influence. The Project is a great demonstration about the impact a single student can have by asking questions. It also makes us question the legacy we want to leave for the next generation. The way in which Norman first got involved with the Project teaches us to never think of anyone as "unreachable." Norman explained that if you find a cause you are passionate about there is no harm in reaching out to the people involved. You never know how important they may become in your community in the future.

We, JSU at Agnes Irwin, realized the importance of quantifying what "six-million looks like" in our community, and we are in the midst of creating our own Project. We plan to collect six-million pennies to not only quantify the number six-million, but to fight the stereotype of Jews being "cheap" as we have historically had pennies thrown at us. The Project has influenced our communities, and will continue to influence many more. We thank Norman for taking the time to educate the Agnes Irwin community.

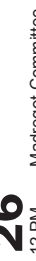
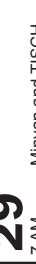
