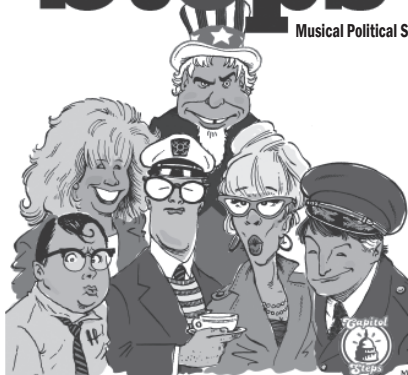

Message from Rabbi Rosenberg

Friends,

This is my final Bulletin message to our community as Senior Rabbi of Har Zion Temple. I am grateful for having been privileged to serve you for these past five years. In God's order there is work for everyone to do and it is beyond my understanding how that plan plays out in life. Not everyone has to be the President, Prime Minister, or the CEO. We are each called to fulfill tasks and help our world in a variety of ways. congregation for Minha through Havdalah. All are welcome!

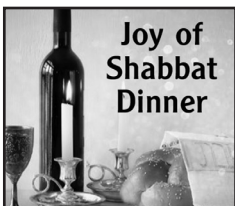

LMAHH Celebrates a Successful Year! Onward and Upward!

Message from **Norman Einhorn**

The Lower Merion Area Hebrew High, LMAHH, is celebrating the conclusion of a successful first year! With 128 students strong, LMAHH brought together 8-12 graders from Har Zion, Adath Israel, Beth Am Israel and Temple Beth Hillel-Beth El to learn and socialize together as Jewish teens.

What started out as an 'experiment,' is now a rich, vibrant, hopeful and energetic collaborative community atmosphere. Looking back on the highlights from our first year, it is hard to pinpoint just one shining moment – even though I have to say that the live llamas (ok, maybe they were alpacas) on our first day made quite the impression.

The classes offered were varied and based on student input. Choices included Hebrew language, social justice, Judaism and social media, *Pirke Avot*, art, Jewish movies and comedy, current events, and Israel. During our *Na'aseh V'Nishma* period (We will do and we will understand), we welcomed guests such as the Israel Guide Dog Center, the Jewish Farm School, StandWithUs, JAFCO, Alexander Muss High School in Israel, The Diller Teen Fellow Program, Jerusalem U, Teen Giving Project and Jewish Philanthropy, disability justice, Jewish Federation, Challah for Hunger, Be an Upstander and more.

Respect In and Out of the Jewish Community

In school, religion, and family, children are taught to always be respectful of their teachers, parents, and friends. But what does respect really mean, and how can we demonstrate it in our communities? For my personal interest project as part of my English class, I chose to discover what it truly means to respect someone, and how respect can be cultivated in the two major communities of my life: my school community and my synagogue. For this article, I will focus on how we can all demonstrate respect within our Jewish community and with others of different faith and different beliefs, using Rabbi Brad Hirschfield's book, *You Don't Have To Be Wrong For Me To Be Right*, as guidance.

It is difficult to open a conversation with someone who has differing opinions. I myself shy away from dialogue that I know will spark argument, not because I am insecure in my own beliefs, but because I try to avoid conversation where I could potentially insult the other person. Rabbi Brad Hirschfield told a story in his book of a similar experience when he was invited to have dinner with President Ahmadinejad of Iran. At first, Hirschfield refused to attend this meeting but later admitted in his book that "[his] 'sin' lay in the claim that disagreement was no excuse for not talking." In the quest to avoid conflict, it is possible that we are putting ourselves at a disadvantage. Instead of opening up our minds to someone else's beliefs, we shut down potentially beneficial conversation before it even begins.

In Chapter Four of *Pirkei Avot*, Rabbi Ben Zoma poses the question, "Who is wise?" Then proceeds to answer that "[he is] the one who learns from every person, not about what they already believe, or from those people with whom they largely

agree – but from every person." We are being narrow-minded by refusing to have tough conversations where disagreement may occur. It is in human nature to avoid conflict for self-preservation, but we need to lead those hard conversations in order to truly be wise. Rabbi Hirschfield describes in another experience that when meeting with Elias Kesrouani, a Lebanese-Palestinian priest: "There were many places where he differed from me... the real issue was our willingness to live with genuine openness to each other." Hirschfield encourages his audience to become the wise man by telling his own stories of times both when he succeeded and when he did not. The juxtaposition between Hirschfield's two stories demonstrates how every person has the capacity for change: every person can become less narrow-minded and more open-minded to the thoughts and beliefs of others.

The prophet Isaiah once stated, "My house will be a house of prayer for all peoples." Isaiah is not necessarily pointing to a specific building, such as a synagogue, but to each of us. We are the house of prayer that Isaiah is referring to; each of us has the capacity to listen and internalize the thoughts and ideas of all people, even those with whom we disagree. Hirschfield explains how "the word integrity has the same root as integrate [so] when we fight for the integrity of our beliefs ... we are actually fighting to integrate that which seems alien or threatening [and] we will have the most integrity when we are integrating the widest range of people and ideas" (154). It is our job to integrate in ourselves the beliefs of others, to change our mind from time to time, and to develop our own beliefs and ideas. That is my definition of respect.

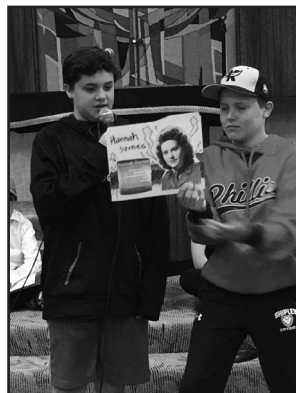

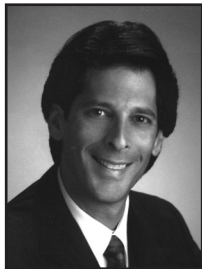
