We have been blessed in recent months to welcome several new babies into the Jewish community and into the Har Zion family with *Brit Milah* and Baby Naming ceremonies. These are wonderful events filled with the joy of proud parents and grandparents, supportive friends and extended family, and with the promise that we see in the eyes of a new Jewish child. Of the various rituals that accompany events such as these, a centerpiece is the giving of the name itself.

In our tradition, as in many others around the world, we name our children after important people in our lives, be they relatives no longer with us, important teachers and mentors, or simply people of inspiration



who have touched us deep in our hearts. The hope is that by giving them that name, this new child will embody some of the values and character traits of that person. Names are a way to bring our past experiences into alignment with our aspirations for the future.

the form of different services and study opportunities on Shabbat. Until now they have been nameless because as a professional leadership team we were still searching for the right name to capture the aspirations we hope for in these new offerings.

For example, our main service each Shabbat will now be referred to as Kol Tefilah - the Voice of Prayer. This is both a description and an aspiration. Descriptive because when you attend that service, you hear the voice and the sounds of prayer. Aspirational because we hope your voices will continue to contribute to the rich sound that emanates from our sanctuary. Kol HaMishpacha (the Voice of the Family) is our new family service for Shabbat mornings. Again, it describes who it is for but encapsulates the hope that on Shabbat mornings at Har Zion we will hear the sounds of families celebrating Shabbat together. Kol Zimra is what we are calling our Friday night instrumental service. Meaning the **Voice of Song**, our hope is that through the addition of instrumentation, it will inspire us to a deeper relationship with each other through communal singing. Lilmod U'Lelamed means to learn and to teach which is exactly what we aim to do in the Saturday morning learning service. (continued on page 3)



Sisterhood Adult Ed Focuses on Pressing Issues of Today

One of the easiest ways to get involved with Sisterhood while expanding your knowledge is through Sisterhood's adult education programs. Sisterhood offers courses all year long that appeal to an array of interests. You will leave each class fulfilled and better informed. And, there is the added bonus of bonding with each other through study.

We begin our programming in October and will have three panel discussions about Jewish Life on College Campuses. The first class, "Making Your Jewish Way to College: Search, Application and Essays," will be taught by Rabbi Howard Alpert, the CEO of Hillel of Greater Philadelphia, and Joan Koven, an independent educational consultant with Academic Access. This program will focus on Jewish considerations in the search and application process. We then turn to "Jewish Life on Campus," where we will hear about the array of opportunities available on campus. We will conclude with a class addressing the "Coalition Building on Campus: the Fight Against the Movement to Isolate Israel."

Our November course, taught by Rabbi Ellen Bernhardt, will focus on understanding the Israeli legal system and its impact on its Jewish, Christian and Muslim citizens. We will examine the impact of this system on Orthodox and non-Orthodox women as well as the Law of Return. And in December, Rabbi Rosenberg will share with us his unique expertise as we explore how to construct and deconstruct sacred documents. We will learn what constitutes a sacred document, why specific training is required to handle these documents and what spiritual lessons are contained within them.

Second semester's courses focus on freedom, rights and responsibilities. After winter break, we resume class in February with Dr. Sara H. Cohen teaching us about the Hagaddah, its history, writers, content, liturgy and the ideas inherent in it.

In Marcha and April, we then turn our focus to our community with our themes of "Aiding our Aging and Disabled Community Members" and "Safety in Our Community." In March, we begin with Rabbi Nogah Marshall and Rabbi Charles Sherman presenting a Jewish perspective on supporting the vulnerable in our community. Our next class, "Caring for our Jewish Elderly," will be a panel discussion about government policies impacting the elderly and how our community meets the needs of our aging population. Our panelists are Carole Irvine, President and CEO of Abramson Center for Jewish Life; Andre Krug, President and CEO of Kleinlife; and Brian Gralnick, Director of Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia's Center for Social Responsibility. Our final class in this series, "Supporting Individuals with Special Needs," will feature a panel discus-(continued on page 12)

On Simhat Torah, we completed the

Five Books of Moses. And when we complete the Torah we recite a special phrase "Chazak Chazak Venitchazek" - Be strong Be strong and we will be strengthened. At first glance the word Chazak appears to be of importance, but in fact what is so meaningful in this statement is the use of the word "together." V'nitchazek, together we will be strengthened. The entire Jewish people as a community together begins a new chapter and book by reading from the Torah.

Those in need range in age from 60 to 100. They receive 5 - 14 meat, poultry, fish and dairy nutritious meals per week. All meals are provided for free or below cost so that needy seniors can afford their prescriptions and other vital expenses.




