### **INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS** *Night-time Driving is About to Become Safer*

Anyone who has squinted into the glare of oncoming headlights — or who has struggled to see out the windshield during a storm — knows the dangers of poor visibility while driving. Israeli startup BrightWay Vision is working to solve this problem. The company's new "BrightEye" technology provides an "enlightening" experience, both literally and figuratively. The screen on the car's dashboard provides a clear, panoramic view of the road, similar to that achieved when turning on one's bright beams, without actually doing so. In addition, the headlights of the cars coming in the opposite direction appear as small dots, with none of the blinding glare. And the entire area around the dirt roads we traverse can be seen with no effort, in spite of the absence of street lamps.
