


Tikkun Olam is Collecting Donations for our Martin Luther King Day of Service – Monday, January 20 We are currently accepting donations of:


# Parents and Kids Together with Rabbi Shawn – Saturday, January 11, 1 PM For 5th Graders and Above



**The BFOR study provides genetic testing for common** *BRCA* **mutations** for women and men of Ashkenazi (Eastern European) Jewish ancestry, age 25 or older, in four U.S. metropolitan areas. 95% of American Jews are Ashkenazi.
