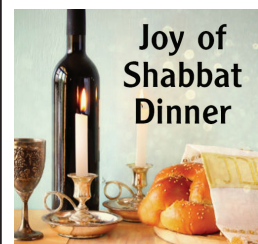

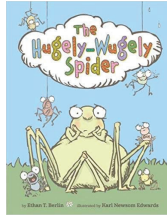

Tikkun Olam: Har Zion Temple at Its Best

Last month, HZT's Tikkun Olam Committee prepared and served dinner for 200 at the Eastern Delaware County Life Center. Four times a year we arrive with home cooked hot meals that recipients line up at the door and around the corner to enjoy. We are greeted by so many people that thank us for coming but we in turn, thank them for coming to eat with us on this night. There are those that want extra pickles, but most are not fussy and just want a chance to fill their bellies. Dessert was pumpkin pie (20 of them to be exact) but somehow the word got out that a few sweet potato pies snuck in there, too. A sweet end to the meal is always appreciated. There are a few people who are not ambulatory so someone is assigned to bring them a plate and there are others that arrive later after the meal service is finished. We prepare a meal for them and set it aside so they don't go without.

It's really simple...people are hungry so we feed them. There are many smiles, laughs and comments about the food (positive most of the time). What permeates the room however, is the good feeling that rises from the steam tables.

We also sent a small but mighty brigade to bring Hanukkah Happiness to residents at Brith Shalom House. Sophisticated seniors we found out, were not so keen on decorating dreidels, but preferred to sing Hanukkah songs in Yiddish and recount stories of their old synagogue affiliations and the simple beauty of a familiar Shabbat service. When you ask residents what they would really like from us at holiday time, they say they would just love visits from the children when they sing and bring their beautiful faces to brighten the day. Several of them said they would like us to come on Shabbat morning with the junior congregation so they could hear the older children read Torah.

Tikkun Olam at Har Zion Temple should do more of this. As they say "it's all good." Please help us expand our outreach by volunteering, sharing your ideas, or just writing Tikkun Olam a little check!
