INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS

Beaming Tumors Away At Half the Cost

Approximately 24 million people worldwide are expected to get cancer each year by 2030, according to Cancer Research UK. The race to find more effective and cheaper therapies led to proton therapy, a type of radiation that uses protons rather than X-rays to treat cancer. Like standard X-ray radiation, proton therapy is radiation therapy based on an external beam that painlessly delivers radiation through the skin to the cancer. The advantage is that proton therapy focuses the ray directly onto the tumor, without damaging surrounding healthy tissue. The treatment uses 60 percent less radiation than normal X-rays, allowing higher doses to be directed to the tumor, increasing the chances that all the tumor cells will be targeted, Cancer UK says. 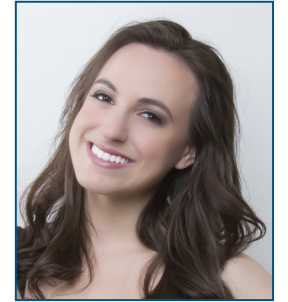

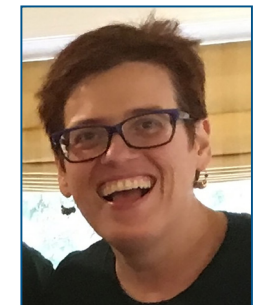
