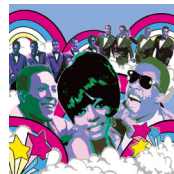

Help Is On the Way for Parents of Little Kids (With Earaches)

Swimmer's Ear is another term for the common earache. But, for parents of small children, it's often a major headache. Little kids don't exactly jump for joy when receiving the cold, oozing liquid ear drops, and parents dread having to administer the ear drops several times a day. You need to hold your kid's head down on its side so the ear drops flow in, and he/she is kicking and screaming the whole time. But, what do you do when your kid is crying with pain from an earache? Enter Israeli start-up Otic Pharma. The company doesn't prevent earaches, but it hopes to make treating your kid's earache much less painful (for all). Instead of using drops as a medicine delivery system, the company uses foam. The proposed once-a-day treatment is easier to apply than drops, and saves parents the headache of multiple "medical procedures" each day. 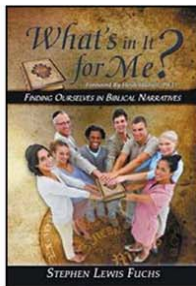
