INNOVATION UPDATE FROM **Cutting Drug Errors In Real-Time**

A new study by Harvard Medical School shows that software developed by Israeli startup MedAware helps reduce prescription errors, potentially saving the lives of patients. In the US alone, medication errors harm at least 1.5 million people every year and cause the annual premature death of more than 220,000 patients, MedAware says on its website. Adverse drug events are among the most common medical errors. Out of the 4 billion medical prescriptions written up annually in the US, 8 million contain life-threatening errors. In the US healthcare market, more than \$20 billion is lost, annually, because of prescription errors and their consequences. The Harvard study analyzed records from almost 800,000 patients to assess the efficacy of MedAware's software. The report found that MedAware's technology identifies errors, otherwise undetected by current systems in use, minimizing the risks arising from fatigued doctors who are used to getting false alerts from current systems, and reducing prescription errors with high accuracy. 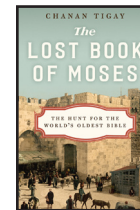
