JOHN EFRON // THE JEWISH DOCTOR: A BRIEF HISTORY

National Museum of American Jewish History, 5th and Market Sts, Philadelphia

For many Jews, the Jewish doctor personifies success, but most don't realize the central importance of medicine in Jewish modernization. Physicians were important to politics as well as health in the nineteenth century, especially in Germany. Medical advice about such things as Jewish diet, childcare, and burial practices helped narrow the cultural gap between Jews and the rest of society, just as they were on the cusp of attaining equal rights. This talk will explore how medicine helped bring science to German Jewry, and, more broadly, how it shaped modern Jewish culture.
