INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISFALL Fixing Children's Broken Hearts

Nearly 5000 children from across the globe are living normal lives thanks to free heart surgeries they received care of Israeli doctors. The kids live in 51 countries – some of which have no diplomatic relations with Israel – including Syria, Iraq, Pakistan, Haiti, Tanzania, China, Ukraine, Sudan, Sierra Leone, and Angola.

Save a Child's Heart (SACH), an international humanitarian organization based in Israel, is the most prominent group giving children with cardiac conditions a healthier future. Founded in 1995, SACH has treated more than 4,000 children brought to Wolfson Medical Center in Holon from areas ravaged by war or natural disaster.

About half the patients are from Gaza and the West Bank, Jordan, Iraq and Morocco; more than 30 percent are from Africa; and the rest are from Asia, Eastern Europe and the Americas. All costs are covered by donors including the European Union's Partnership for Peace Program, USAID, and the German foundation Ein Herz fur Kinder.


