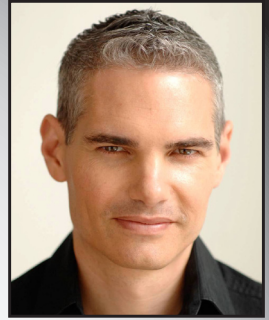
New cyber-security method: beat hackers through confusion and disruption

Israeli company Illusive has done just that: it has developed a technology that beats hackers by getting them to chase their own tail – by letting them mine phony data that ends up leading nowhere. It is a new model of cyber-security tech in which an invisible (to users) layer of security is overlaid on a system, set up especially for hackers who are able to breach traditional defenses. 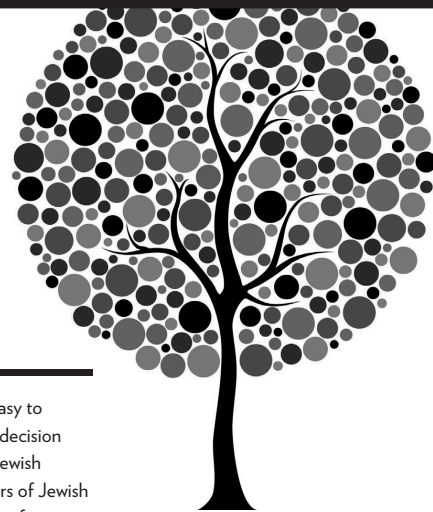
