Stopping Cancer From Spreading

Like humans who communicate with each other to get things done, so do the cells inside our bodies. Cells transmit messages from their outer walls to their inner center, prompting the cell to take action. This communication system can create mutations that can give rise to a "spam mail" that promotes cancer. Now, it turns out that if cancerous cells don't receive certain messages, the spread of cancer throughout the body can be stopped. 


