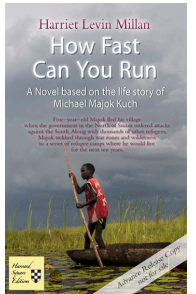

In this post-password age, the watchword is "biometrics" – a digital way to measure a person's unique physiological features, especially fingerprints, face, voice and iris. "Everybody and their sister that has a service of value are interested in biometrics ... because you won't remember your password when you need it in an emergency," says Benjamin Levy, CEO of IsItYou, one of many Israeli companies in the biometrics space. Because your physical features cannot be lost, forgotten or stolen, institutions from banks to hospitals are seeking biometric technologies to raise the bar for security, monitoring and accuracy.

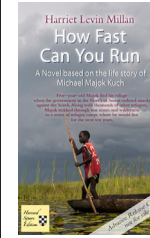

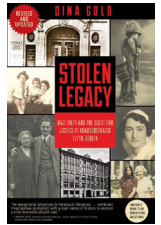
Stolen Legacy – Nazi Theft and the Quest for Justice at Krausenstrasse 17/18, Berlin
