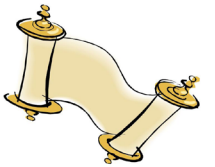

impacting over 720,000 people. Innovation: Africa installations provide schools and medical clinics with solar power that allows them to offer evening study, well-lit nighttime medical care and refrigeration for medicines and vaccines.

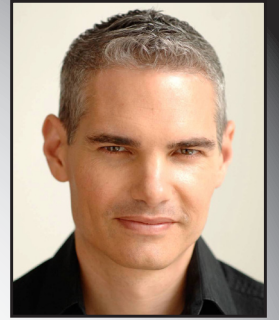
