INNOVATION UPDATE FROM *ISTAEL/DEAS* An Injection That Melts Fat Holds Promise

Obesity has become a worldwide epidemic with the cost to treat obesity in the United States expected to rise from \$325 billion in 2014 to \$555 billion per year by 2025. The World Obesity Federation predicts there will be 2.7 billion overweight and obese adults by that time.

Put more starkly: A third of the world's population will be overweight or obese in less than a decade. The United States already reached that point in 2014. But even developing countries like Egypt are predicted to jump to similar obesity levels in the same time period if nothing changes.
