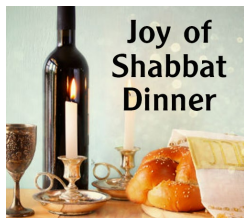

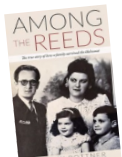

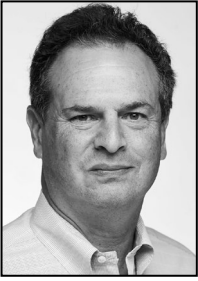

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM  ISRAEL IDEAS

Helping to Save Lives in Emergency Situations

An Israeli startup that combines Augmented Reality technology and drones has become a serious aid tool for first responders on rescue missions and disasters zones, especially across the United States.

Edgybees, headquartered in Palo Alto, California with offices in an Israeli community in northern Israel, has developed a real-time platform that improves “situational awareness” for rescue teams through software that overlays real-time 3D mapping and data on to live video from fast-moving cameras on drones, cars, helicopters, aerial platforms, and even body-worn accessories. The company last month raised \$5.5 million in a seed funding round led by Our Crowd, with participation from the venture capital arm of Motorola Solutions, a firm Edgybees CEO and co-founder Adam Kaplan refers to as “the biggest company in public safety”, Verizon Ventures, 8VC, NFX, and Aspect Ventures.
