Wednesdays, November 8, 15, 22, 29 - 10:30-11:30 AM



Balancing Justice and Forgiveness: Some Biblical Insights with Emilie S. Passow, Ph.D.

The Folding Car That Shrinks To Fit Motorbike Parking

A new vision for urban transportation was unveiled at the fifth annual International Fuel Choices and Smart Mobility Summit in Tel Aviv. The made-in-Israel City Transformer is an electric smart car whose wheelbase folds in at the push of a button to fit into a motorcycle parking space. City Transformer is touted as the world's first vehicle of its kind. CEO Asaf Formoza and Chief Innovation Officer Udi Meridor spoke as the City Transformer concept car was being assembled in Petah Tikva earlier this month. "We have collaborations and partnerships with huge companies, including Yamaha Motor Ventures; Altair, which makes simulation software for Ferrari, Fiat and other manufacturers to assure stable handling; and Rassini, a tier-one suspension company in Mexico that works with Mercedes, Maserati and other luxury brands," said Formoza, who has a PhD in mechanical engineering from Ben-Gurion University.
