

From Reading to Meaning: A Comprehensive Exploration of the Prayer Book



Growing New Bone From Israeli Desert Corals

An Israeli bone-graft product made of enhanced coral has received approval to start sales in Europe for dental and orthopedic procedures. This unique product is made from corals grown in a closed system, using patented technology to provide bioactivity and eliminate biological contamination.

The CEO Ohad Schwartz of CoreBone explains, "Bone grafts ideally should have four features". "They must be bioactive, not just a passive scaffold, in order to attract new bone cells; they must be strong enough to support the site, especially for implants; they must allow for being replaced as new bone grows; and they must be porous to enable vascularity," meaning that blood vessels can grow through them naturally and produce growth of bone from the inside out".
