INNOVATION UPDATE FROM Enabling the Blind To See

In Prof. Amedi's world-renowned Lab for Brain and Multisensory Research at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, people with vision impairment can "see" their environment with the aid of sensory substitution devices (SSDs) that provide visual information from sound and touch. Now, two of the lab's groundbreaking inventions are being readied for the mass market in Braininnovations, the Israel Brain Technologies' four-month accelerator program.

EyeCane is a flashlight-like orientation device. It releases infrared rays to translate distance into auditory and tactile cues, allowing the user to sense objects within an adjustable range of up to 16 feet. EyeCane users, after a brief training, can estimate distances, avoid obstacles and successfully navigate in simple environments. "The white cane is from 1921," says Daphna Rosenbaum, CEO of RenewSenses, a pre-startup based on Amedi's research in the medical neurobiology department of the university's Institute for Medical Research Israel-Canada.

Drew Bergman is a senior at Temple University. While Drew is a successful full-time student with a bright future ahead, this was not always the case. Drew's early teenage years were filled with a severe case of depression. For a brief time, he was able to hide his depression and continue to perform as an outstanding athlete and solid student. However, in his sophomore year of high school Drew experienced a turning point in his recovery when he attempted suicide for the second time.

Drew is a 2014 recipient of the Need In Deed Community Partner Award. He was a presenter at the national SADD conference and was one of the keynote speakers at the Pennsylvania State PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) Conference where he presented to 1,000 educators and school counselors.
