Israeli Virtual Realty Camera Goes to Space for a National Geographic Film

A virtual reality (VR) camera has been sent into space to take part in a National Geographic documentary directed by Oscar-nominated Darren Aronofsky, said Human Eyes, an Israel-based firm that produced the camera. The camera will be used by astronaut Paolo Nespoli to get 3D, 360-degree shots of life and work aboard the International Space Station, a joint US-Russian-Japanese-EU-Canadian low-orbit project. The footage will feed into the documentary titled "One Strange Rock."

For Human Eyes, being part of the space project represents a major coup in the virtual reality market, one that comes on the heels of much work, research, trial and error. Established in 2000, the Israeli firm, which has more than 70 patents to its name, was initially focused on printing technologies and only approached VR in 2014.
