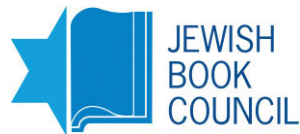

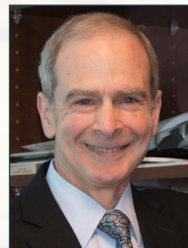

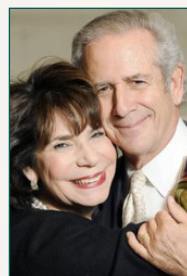

The Nazi Titanic – The Incredible Untold Story of a Doomed Ship in World War II

Built in 1927, the German ocean liner Cap Arcona was the greatest ship since the Titanic. When the Nazis seized control of the vessel, she was stripped down for use as a floating barracks, and for troop and prisoner transport. In the Third Reich's final days, this ship was mistakenly bombed by the British Air Force, killing the concentration camp prisoners packed aboard. Robert P. Watson uncovers forgotten records of this doomed ship.
