Shifting from Performance to Practice: What Are We Doing When We 'Do Jewish'?

An introduction to the idea of Jewish practice as making "unifications" – internally, with others and the world; to speak about what it means to engage in "prayer as practice"; and living a life of intentionality as the goal of Jewish practice.

Teachings from *A Partner in Holiness* by Rabbi Jonathan Slater Mishpatim (Vol 1, p 218)

The Gaon, R. Eliahu of Vilna, comments: "Just as water reflects back according to the face that is presented – if one distorts his face, that is what the water will reflect – so is one person's heart to another. If your heart is positively directed toward another person, he will respond in the same manner, even if the latter doesn't really know what is the heart of the former."

...One way to check out how we're doing, to get a read on our own inner state, might be to look carefully at how people respond to us...When we are met with a frown, a scowl, a worried look, we might inquire, "Is that my reflection?" When we see a healthy glowing countenance before us, we might want to know, "Could that be me?" as well.

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM STAEL COMPETERS TO BE THE WAZE OF Indoor Spaces

The Israeli navigation app Waze will steer you to your destination along the fastest route. But it can't help you find your way inside a mall, museum, school, hospital, airport or other large building because GPS doesn't work indoors. This problem has caught the attention of tech companies large and small, including Google and Apple, yet today's indoor maps haven't mastered live navigation functionality.

Three Israeli companies are meeting this challenge with sophisticated indoor orientation apps independent of beacons or any other hardware installations in the venue. Each approach is slightly different.
