Engaging Jerusalem

"If I forget thee, O Jerusalem..."

Jerusalem has captured the imagination of Jews for centuries. It's the direction to which we pray, it's the aspiration of centuries of dreamers, it holds hope and promise for many.

In honor of the 50th anniversary of the Six Day War, Har Zion will engage our *kehillah* in a celebration of the city of our eternal city of hope. Over the next eight months, we will explore the diverse role Jerusalem has played for us as a people, from biblical times to present day.

Each month has been assigned a verb that will guide our exploration. We've dedicated February to *Singing Jerusalem*. The number of songs about Jerusalem is nearly endless since the themes of the holiness and centrality of Jerusalem, returning to Zion and longing for Jerusalem have been a part of Jewish literature since Biblical times.

Lach Yerushalayim-1967

The City of Jerusalem was reclaimed during the Six-Day War, causing a great joy and pride in the Jewish people. This song, "*Lach Yerushalayim*" with a very identifiable sound of that era, was written by Amos Ettinger and Eli Rubinstein. It clearly demonstrates the excitement, if not the euphoria that existed amongst Jews everywhere. The song quickly became a popular Israeli folk dance which was "exported" around the world. This video illustrates the dance being taught to a group of Japanese folk dancers.

For you Jerusalem, a riddle and secret.

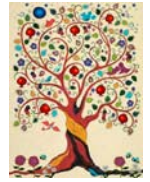

Revolutionary Israeli device can eliminate need for follow-up breast cancer surgery - *MarginProbe, which checks tumor's edges while lumpectomy patient is still on operating table, is already in use in over 100 US hospitals*

Israel's Dune Medical Devices has developed an instrument to help women with breast cancer avoid undergoing dreaded follow-up surgery to remove residual cancer cells after a tumor is removed.
