Enjoy the works of Yiddish authors, poets, songs, theater and cinema and incidentally learn the language.

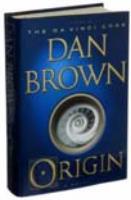
Learning our Liturgy with Dr. Sara H. Cohen

Dr. Ely Levine – *Passover in Egypt, Passover in Babylon, Passover in the Main Line*

Did the Israelites drink four cups of wine at the first Passover? The seder we know now took its shape among the rabbis of the Talmud, but it has continued to be transformed over the centuries. The innovation has always come about a way to rediscover meaning in traditional ritual. In this class we will look at the history of how Jews have celebrated Passover, as a way of reigniting meaning in our own celebrations!

Juliet Spitzer – *Guard My Tongue, It's Out of Control! Mastering Our Thoughts So They Don't Master Us*

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS

Breakthrough in Non-invasive Prostate Cancer Test

Israeli scientists at Kaplan Medical Center have reported a breakthrough of successfully detecting prostate cancer cells with high sensitivity using Micromedic Technologies' CellDetect noninvasive diagnostic test, developed at Kaplan over the past two years. The news comes less than a week after British actor and comedian Stephen Fry revealed he is being treated for prostate cancer, which afflicts nearly one adult male in nine sometime during his lifetime. Among many other celebrities who have battled prostate cancer are Robert De Niro, Mandy Patinkin, Harry Belafonte and Frank Zappa. Prostate cancer is the second most common cancer (after skin cancer) among men worldwide and is the third-leading cause of death in men worldwide. The disease is very treatable if found early, and in some cases the cancer grows very slowly and does not need treatment. However, each year there are about 29,000 deaths from prostate cancer in the United States and 70,000 in Europe.
