INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS Revealing Hidden Insights Into Your Health

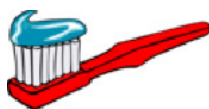


Hummus Making Monday, March 27, 7 PM

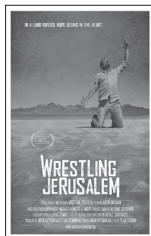

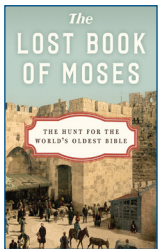
The Lost Book of Moses: The Hunt for the World's Oldest Bible
