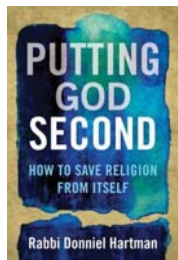

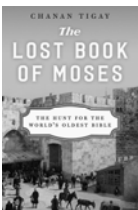

In the early afternoon of November 22, 1963, Abraham Zapruder stood in Dealey Plaza eagerly awaiting the arrival of President Kennedy's motorcade. Instead, his 26-second home movie captured President Kennedy's assassination and thrust Zapruder – and his family – into the national spotlight for decades.

Now Abraham's granddaughter, Alexandra Zapruder, tells the complete story of the Zapruder film for the first time.

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM **Revealing Hidden Insights Into Your Health**
