INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISF BEL

Helping Pathologists' Process and Analyze Biopsies for Cancer More Accurately and Quickly Today, most diagnoses of diseases including cancer are performed by pathologists, who examine tissue taken during biopsy and determine whether it is normal, benign or malignant. This painstaking process, using slides and a microscope, has remained stagnant over the past century, requiring years of training. Even a small cluster of unnoticed cancer cells can lead to a possibly fatal misdiagnosis.

Now Nucleai, a Tel Aviv-based startup, is developing an AI pathology system to help pathologists in the job. "My father was suspected to have prostate cancer and it was a very stressful month until he received negative biopsy results," said Avi Veidman, the firm's co-founder and CEO and a graduate of an elite technological unit of the Israeli Military Intelligence corps specializing in computer vision.
