Dr. Ely Levine – Passover in Egypt, Passover in Babylon, Passover in the Main Line

Did the Israelites drink four cups of wine at the first Passover? The seder we know now took its shape among the rabbis of the Talmud, but it has continued to be transformed over the centuries. The innovation has always come about as a way to rediscover meaning in traditional ritual. In this class we will look at the history of how Jews have celebrated Passover, as a way of reigniting meaning in our own celebrations!

Aviva Habib – *Hebrew Music and Poetry - Cultural Development*A closer look into how Israeli culture has developed over the last 70 years.



Helping Pathologists' Process and Analyze Biopsies for Cancer More Accurately and Quickly

Today, most diagnoses of diseases including cancer are performed by pathologists, who examine tissue taken during biopsy and determine whether it is normal, benign or malignant. This painstaking process, using slides and a microscope has remained stagnant over the past century, requiring years of training. Even a small cluster of unnoticed cancer cells can lead to a possibly fatal misdiagnosis.

Now Nucleai, a Tel Aviv-based startup, is developing an AI pathology system to help pathologists in the job. "My father was suspected to have prostate cancer and it was a very stressful month until he received negative biopsy results," said Avi Veidman, the firm's co-founder and CEO and a graduate of an elite technological unit of the Israeli Military Intelligence corps specializing in computer vision.
