Ben-Gurion University of the Negev (BGU) and the Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center joined together to set up a company seeking to commercialize a new system which will make it easier for medical practitioners to insert needles into veins for a range of medical procedures, like taking blood or intra-venous feeding.

The new company, Xact Medical, will further develop and bring to market the Fast Intelligent Needle Delivery (FIND) system that uses robotics and ultrasound to guide and insert a needle into a patient's body. According to a joint statement, the technology, which combines clinical, research and engineering expertise, will be particularly significant for children, as their vascular systems are so small and precision can be critical.
