INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS

Successfully Growing Bones In A Lab

Haifa-based biotech company Bonus BioGroup has entered the second trial of a clinical study seeking to regrow bones in a lab. The first trial, which began four years ago and comprised 32 patients, was completed successfully, according to Dr. Shai Meretzki, CEO and founder of Bonus BioGroup. The process they have designed could come out of an H.G. Wells novel. Liposuction is used to retrieve fat cells from the body, from which damage-controlling cells are isolated. The isolated cells are then grown in a bioreactor, a man-made simulation of the human body. After two weeks, the new bone, tailored to the patient's needs, is injected back inside of the patient in the form of thousands of tiny, living bone particles called BonoFill.

The innovation has always come about a way to rediscover meaning in traditional ritual.
