INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS Going Undercover To Save Syrian Lives

Some 200 or so Israeli volunteers working for the Doreen Gold's nonprofit, II4Syrians, have been operating in stealth mode since the revolution began in 2011. It's a dangerous job for anyone, but for Israelis the consequences of exposure are unthinkable. Doreen, whose name has been changed to hide her identity, signed a form that says that if she is captured, the government will not negotiate for her release. It's a form that all of her volunteers – Arab, Jewish, Christian and Druze – must fill out before they leave on a mission.

Since 1994, Doreen, a mother of two, has been giving aid in some of the worst humanitarian disasters of the last couple of decades. The tsunami in Southeast Asia, devastating flooding in Chechnya, the earthquake in Haiti. She's responded to crises in Iraq, Pakistan, Indonesia, Rwanda and Darfur.
