THE PASSOVER PROJECT A Jewish Campaign Against Slavery



This year Har Zion Temple joins an ever-growing number of Jewish institutions across the country bringing awareness to the plight of slaves around the world today. Slavery is not legal anywhere, but it is practiced everywhere. Slavery is found wherever goods or services depend on manual labor. Worldwide, an estimated 21 to 36 million people are trapped and working without pay, under threat of violence. According to the International Labour Organization (ILO), slavery generates about \$150 billion a year in profits for human traffickers.

Each week between now and Pesah, the Festival of Our Freedom, we will present you with materials which will both enhance your seder experience as well as to suggest things that you can do to relieve the plight of slaves in the world today. All faith begins with the act of questioning. From God's first question to Adam and Even in Eden – Ayekah, "Where are you?" – to Abraham's challenge to God concerning Sodom and Gomorrah, to Sarah's exasperating and agonizing question about whether she would ever bear children, to Moses questioning Pharaoh's authority, the Jewish people have always been intoxicated with the art of questioning. Perhaps we who were slaves are constantly in a state of remembering the degradation and seeking never to forget. It is the privilege of free people to ask questions; this is the birthplace of our compassion and our zeal for justice. Four Questions About Modern Slavery

We start the seder by noticing what is out of the ordinary and then investigating its meaning further. How is this night different from all other nights?

On all other nights, we depend on the exploitation of invisible others for our food, clothing, homes, and more. **Tonight**, we listen to the stories of those who suffer to create the goods we use. We commit to working toward the human rights of all workers.

On all other nights, we have allowed human life to become cheap in the economic quest for the cheapest goods. **Tonight**, we commit to valuing all people, regardless of their race, class, or circumstances.

On all other nights, we have forgotten that poverty, migration, and gender-based violence leave people vulnerable to exploitation, including modern-day slavery. **Tonight**, we commit to taking concrete actions to end this exploitation and its causes.

On all other nights, we have forgotten to seek wisdom among those who know how to end slavery—the people who have experienced this degradation. **Tonight**, we commit to slavery prevention that is rooted in the wisdom and experience of workers, trafficking survivors, and affected communities. When the seder has ended, we will not return to how it has been "on all other nights." We commit to bringing the lessons of this seder into our actions tomorrow, the next day, and every day to come.

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISTAEL

Ohio Campus Goes Beta Over Israeli Start-Up Water System

Sinclair Community College in Dayton became the first pilot site to test the Woosh filtered drinking water stations outside of Israel. At a Woosh Water Station, customers can take virtually any bottle or cup of their own (up to 32 oz.) and fill it with filtered, chilled tap water; the charge is 50 cents for up to 20 oz., 75 cents for 32 oz., payable by credit card or through a pre-purchased subscription. For another 15 cents, customers can cleanse a drinking bottle before reuse with the station's 03 purification system.

The Woosh CEO said, "One of our challenges is to convince people to stop buying the next bottled water. We're promoting tap water. Because, actually bottled water is tap water (that's) filtered, shipped, and that's unbelievable in terms of carbon emissions. You get the same quality pure water without the plastic. So, you save the environment and money. We want to encourage people again and again to use their own bottle," said the CEO. To read more go to: http://www.israelideas.org/#!current/c1gqf.
