This program is made possible through the Sauer Family Yom Hashoah Fund.

Evelyn Pike Rubin, an acclaimed lecturer and Jewish activist, does not want the world to forget the Shoah, nor those who aided the European refugees fleeing the Nazi terror. In her talk, the author vividly describes the survival of approximately 18,000 Jewish refugees in Japanese-occupied Shanghai during World War II. In addressing this almost unknown Holocaust story about the "open city" of Shanghai and its teeming mix of humanity prior to Pearl Harbor, she speaks about the travails that these European refugees experienced in this alien culture and climate. Evelyn's focus is on the extraordinary role the Japanese occupation forces played in assuring the survival of these refugees, even when the long arm of the Gestapo attempted, in vain, to destroy them.

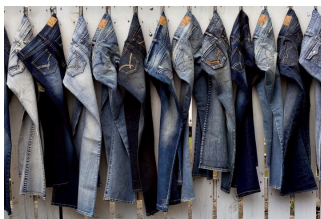

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS

Treating Burns with a Second Skin

Some 180,000 deaths occur each year worldwide because of burn wounds, the World Health Organization (WHO) estimates. In Israel, there were around 3,300 burn wound deaths in 2017, with 84 percent of accidents occurring in the domestic environment, according to the Health Ministry.

Israeli startup Nanomedic Technologies Ltd. has developed a medical device that it says can dress burns and other wounds with nano materials that mimic human tissue and peel off once the skin below is regenerated.
