INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISFAEL

Invertex, a Tel Aviv-based startup, is seeking to change the way people buy shoes. The company wants to digitize the process, using artificial intelligence and 3-D imaging technology to analyze users' feet in stores and to suggest models and sizes that would fit best. The software can also help with online shopping, enabling smartphones to scan feet via an app and making suggestions about what would be the best buy. "Today very few people buy their shoes online and the shoe return rates are crazy," said Invertex CEO David Bleicher. Shoe manufacturers and retailers Nike, Foot Locker and DSW for example, see on average one-third of their shoes shipped back, at their expense, he said. "We focus on a technology to help companies better match their products to their customer needs. This problem exists in eyewear and fashion in general," he said. 
