April 13: Women and Violence – On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the U.S. During one year, this equates to more than 10 million women and men. On a typical day, there are more than 20,000 phone calls placed to domestic violence hotlines nationwide. In domestic violence homicides, women are six times more likely to be killed when there is a gun in the house. Kelly Gabriel, the Community Education Coordinator of the Women's Center of Montgomery County, along with volunteers from the Women's Center, will discuss domestic violence.

April 20: Guns and Our Community – We have a gun violence problem in America. Summer 2015 saw mass shootings in a church, at military recruiting centers, at a movie theater, and in homes. This is in addition to the daily toll of gun violence in our cities – in July 2015, in one night, three people were shot and killed in Philadelphia. Every day, the news makes clear what we already know – we have a widespread and indiscriminate problem.
