INNOVATION UPDATE FROM **ISRAEL IDEAS** *Scent as a New Frontier for Smartphone Apps*

Your Smartphone may soon be able to identify and analyze scent as easily as it scans a QR code or recognizes a voice. Nanoscent, a Haifa-based company, has developed an electronic nose that can detect odors and flavors through a Smartphone. As an extra bonus, the technology might also help jump-start your love life, the company says. Co-founded by Oren Gavriely and Eran Rom, Nanoscent is developing a Smartphone app that, used together with a chip called a "scent recorder," can determine users' scent profile and help them select products, e.g., cosmetics, perfumes and soaps, best suited for them.
