INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISRAEL IDEAS

Pulling Water From Air, Making Calls Without Touch

At the Israel Innovation Showcase at the annual AIPAC Policy Conference in Washington, D.C., more than 18,000 people learned about a technology to extract water from air; an Arab-Israeli business accelerator; a touch-free smartphone and a user-friendly security system for public venues. Elliot Brandt, AIPAC Managing Director of National Affairs, said the showcase exemplified the Israeli "mindset of unrelenting determination to overcome all barriers and conventional thinking ... to defend and protect and heal and transform the world." Prof. Alan Dershowitz introduced Water-Gen whose patented GENius technology generates clean drinking water from the air. Water-Gen's "plug and drink" Atmospheric Water Generator, said to be the world's most energy-efficient module of its kind, can serve the water needs of single households to entire countries, requiring only electricity or solar power. Yom Hashoah Commemoration

Sandra Roberts, founding teacher of the "Paper Clips" Project from Whitwell, Tennessee
Middle school students from the small southeastern Tennessee town of Whitwell created a monument for the Holocaust victims of Nazi Germany. It started in 1998 as a simple 8th-grade project to study other cultures, and then evolved into one gaining worldwide attention.

At last count, over 33 million paper clips had been received.

Paper Clips, an award-winning documentary film about the project, was released in 2004. Students from Har Zion and neighboring synagogues will be celebrating their 6th consecutive year visiting the Children's Holocaust Memorial in Whitwell, Tennessee on Sunday, April 30.



Bea Hollander, Director of the Transcending Trauma Project, part of the Council for Relationships

Since 1991, the Transcending Trauma Project, as part of Council for Relationships, has conducted 305 in-depth life histories with 98 Holocaust survivors, and their children and grandchildren to better understand coping and adaptation after extreme trauma. The project has produced 1200 hours of interviews which are permanently preserved as digital files. The Phil Wachs and Juliet Spitzer Archive of the Transcending Trauma Project is housed at the US Holocaust Memorial Museum and is available onsite to the public.

In 2015, the archive was given to Yad Vashem and Temple University's Special Collections Research Center.

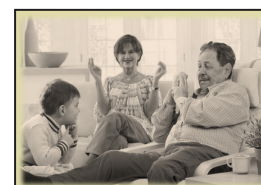


Engaging Jerusalem

Achinoam Nini (known also as Noa), Israeli born of Yemenite origin, raised in the US, resides in Israel with her husband and three children. She is Israel's leading international singer/songwriter, having shared the stage with superstars such as Sting, Pat Metheny, Quincy Jones, Stevie Wonder, Andrea Bocelli and many more, and is Israel's first Good Will Ambassador for FAO, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN.
