Israeli Tech for Mass-Notification Alerts Saves Lives

When Lior Shalev, CEO of eVigilo, arrived at his office, he checked into the back office of his company's emergency mass-notification system to ensure that it was working smoothly in Chile. A few hours earlier, a major earthquake of magnitude 7.1 had struck the South American country and rocked the capital of Santiago.

eVigilo makes a geo-targeted system that enables officials to send out mass alerts simultaneously to computers, mobile phones, radio, sirens, social networks and television within seconds — even if all regular networks are busy.
