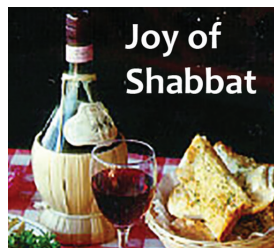

INNOVATION UPDATE FROM **ISRAEL IDEAS** **Protecting Astronauts from Space Radiation Exposure**

Israel's Space Agency (ISA) and NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) announced that they were joining forces to protect astronauts in space from radiation exposure, tapping into technology developed by Israeli company StemRad for a radiation protection vest it created, the AstroRad, set to be tested in deep space. NASA is set to launch the AstroRad into space as part of the last test flight of its Orion spacecraft, with dummies on deck, before manned missions begin. The launch is planned for 2019 and the spacecraft will spend about three weeks in space, including in retrograde orbit around the moon. The trial will involve testing the new protective suit against cosmic gamma rays as part of a feasibility study for any future mission to Mars. The dummies will be provided by the German Aerospace Center (DLR), with whom the Israel Space Agency signed an agreement last year for collaboration in the examination of deep space radiation effects and its absorption in the human body towards understanding the benefits provided by AstroRad. The dummies will be fitted with thousands of radiation sensors, one of which will wear the AstroRad suit and another which will not.

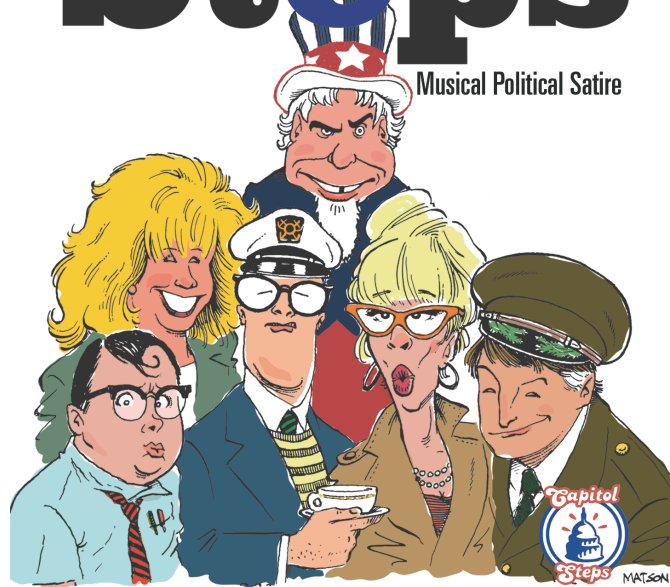
