INNOVATION UPDATE FROM ISLAEL

In 1999, Yuval Tamir was diagnosed with advanced colon cancer. He was told he had only a few weeks to live. Today, Yuval and his wife, Tal, head a company called Infimer. The propriety technology transforms unsorted municipal solid waste into inexpensive raw material for the plastic industry that can be used to manufacture anything from toolboxes to lawn furniture to plumbing pipes. There is a direct relationship between his dire prognosis and his budding business. "I served in the Israeli Navy for 20 years and two more years in a naval intelligence unit, and then a few months after I retired I found myself with cancer," Tamir said. He felt strongly that determining what had caused the cancer was the key to conquering it. His inquiries led to government-sponsored studies showing an increased incidence of cancer and chronic diseases among hundreds of naval commando divers exposed to toxic pollution in Israel's Kishon River and Haifa Bay up until 1995.
