When the ambulance on which teenager Eli Beer was volunteering in the 1980s was stuck in Jerusalem traffic, failing to reach a choking child in time, he envisioned squads of neighborhood-based volunteers who could reach patients quickly and begin first aid until the ambulance arrives. In 1989, he equipped 15 volunteer first-responders in his neighborhood with police scanners, planting the seed for a nationwide volunteer emergency medical services organization, United Rescue (known as United Hatzalah (UH) in Israel).

The organization sends humanitarian-aid teams to disaster areas around the world and as of 2016, UH's 3,000 volunteers have treated 1.6 million people in Israel. Over the past few years, large cities in Brazil, Panama, Argentina, India, Lithuania, New Jersey and Michigan have asked this Israeli NGO to help them set up similar systems in order to get aid to victims of accidents and illness within three minutes.
