Israelis, Palestinians Work with Local Flowers To Combat Cancer, Diabetes

Tropical rain forests are home to plants that have been used in 65 percent of promising anti-cancer drugs. Medicinal flowers grow in the Mediterranean climate as well. In the last three years, Israeli and Palestinian researchers have joined efforts to discover the untapped potential of local plants. Researchers have discovered plant properties to be used in the treatment of diabetes, infections and viral diseases. The collaborative research project, named Bio-Xplore was led by Israeli professors from Hadassah Academic College. Israeli, Palestinian, Greek and Spanish researchers screened thousands of plant samples and analyzed plant properties such as antioxidant, anti-viral, anti-bacterial, anti-cancer and anti-fungal agents. The rich cultural heritage of the indigenous peoples provided a start, as much of the information about the medicinal uses of plants was based on folklore.
