Nanoparticles of zinc oxide can eradicate even antibiotic resistant bacteria such as MRSA, per the company. Alan Cooperman is Director of Religion Research at the Pew Research Center. He is an expert on religion's role in U.S. politics and has reported on religion in Russia, the Middle East and Europe.
