Alan Cooperman is Director of Religion Research at the Pew Research Center. He is an expert on religion's role in U.S. politics and has reported on religion in Russia, the Middle East and Europe. He plays a central role in planning the project's research agenda and writing its reports. Before joining the Pew Research Center, he was a national reporter and editor at the Washington Post, foreign editor of U.S. News & World Report, and a foreign correspondent for the Associated Press. He graduated magna cum laude from Harvard in 1982 and started in

journalism at the Berkshire Eagle in Pittsfield, Mass. He is an author of *Mormons in America*, Muslim Americans, the *U.S. Religious Knowledge Survey*, "Nones" on the Rise and A Portrait of Jewish Americans. He also was the primary

editor of the 2014 U.S. Religious Landscape Study and The Future of World Religions. He has appeared on numerous media outlets, including NPR, BBC, Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty, the NewsHour, NBC, ABC, CBS, CNN, Fox, MSNBC and C-SPAN.

# Make Any Fabric Antibacterial, Preventing Infections

The Israel-based company Nano Textile has developed a technology that can transform any fabric into one that kills bacteria. Bacterial infections acquired during hospitalization are a major cause of illness and death. The World Health Organization has estimated that over 500 million people worldwide are infected during hospitalization, a high percentage of which are caused by highly resistant bacteria, such as Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA). These infections not only take a toll of approximately 14 million lives worldwide per year, but also pose a significant financial burden by increasing hospitalization by eight days on average per affected patient. Data provided by Nano Textile indicates that hospital-related costs in Europe alone are estimated at \$12 billion per year.

The cost-effective technology permanently prevents the growth of bacteria on both natural and synthetic fibers, can prevent the spread of hospital-acquired infections, and can reduce cross contamination between patients and medical staff, helping reduce secondary infections. Any ready-made textile is transformed into an antibacterial one by embedding zinc-oxide nanoparticles onto the fabric, the company said. Nanoparticles of zinc oxide can eradicate even antibiotic resistant bacteria such as MRSA, per the company.
